My Internship 2012

In the following I would like to write about my internship and about the experiences which I have made in America. In the period from the 30th of July to 24th of August I worked as a Front Desk Coordinator in a physical therapy practice, located in America's state Illinois, Chicago. A few days later he instructed me to create a map with driving directions for patients who drive by car or by bus. I also took telephone calls. I just noticed that everything we learned at school was very helpful, for example I had to say exactly those phrases on the phone we had practiced at school. Another more interesting task was to see how they deal with marketing. Me and another colleague named Paul went to every high school, college and university in Elgin (a place in Chicago). Dr. Abraham sponsors the shirts of soccer and football teams. He had printed the name and address of his practice on the back of the shirts. Our task was to talk to the principal and to keep him up to date.

So, to conclude my report, I have to say that I really loved the experience of working in another country. Although it's really different to stay among people you don't know, especially if they don't speak your language. There was nobody I could talk to. No Germans, no translator. Honestly, I was very afraid of doing mistakes, particularly because of my boss. I didn't want to ruin his business by doing something wrong. But I have to say that the team was very nice. They respected that I was German and they treated me very well, what I truly appreciated. Furthermore, a foreign certificate will be very impressive if I want to apply for a job or at a university.
